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2020-21 'A ZERO ACADEMIC YEAR'

2020 - 21 'A zero academic year' accepted by all educational institutions and declared by government. We had taken this unprecedented time as a challenge and started delivering our best to make it a unique year.

Due to the pandemic COVID-19, 2020 has been unlike any other year for most of us. Government unplanned declaration to Lockdown, made the zero movement, as no one new about Covid and did not know how to handle it, but Parents started doing work from home and school became online Everything from classes to assignments and even exams themselves, moved online. While it was undoubtedly a challenge for education institutions to handle as they were not prepared for the challenge. At the end of this year, I Anand Prasad , Director of Suraj Education Group sharing my views and learnings from this unique pandemic year.

Immediately after Government declaration of Lockdown-1, we conducted an online web conference with our school's principals, IT head and key persons; have a detailed discussion on various issues on COVID-19. My first point was that which I asked to our principals, what did they think, when will pandemic be over? However most of them were pretty sure and confident that Covid pandemic will end soon and routine life will begin again. but Dr. Seema Ahuja (Principal Suraj Sec. 75) and I were quite unsure about it. So we started working on our backup plan.

Adapting to technology was the biggest challenge

Suraj Education Group always encourage to use technology in education. Even before Covid-19 our campus was fully digitalized and we were maintaining our Education ERP system for daily working like accounting, student's attendance, homework, staff records, results, etc. Our website, social media accounts, whatsapp groups, etc. were already in use.

I felt the main issue and the biggest challenge was adapting to technology at advanced level as many of our student are in remote areas where internet connection or mobile internet speed is not up to the mark. Feedback and queries were coming not only from students, parents, but also from our teaching faculty and staff members like bouncers to us. Our team started working hard and trying to resolve all issues for our 37000+ students and 2700+ staff members.

Mr. Ramesh Bhatia (Principal Suraj School Bhiwadi) said "It was biggest challenge initially, particularly to answer student's queries who were not equipped to handle online classes. Students were complaining they got disconnected when they switch on the video. I wanted to understand their real problem and need to solve." Before starting with students, we trained our staff to handle online classes. We had taken the responsibility of training the staff, who needed the training.



In this regard **Ms. Kanika Ghai (Vice Principal Suraj School, Sector 56, Gurugram)** well said "For many teachers, adapting to technology has been no less than going back to school, but as a student this time." We try to update our system, internet connectivity, servers, emailing system, messaging (Text and Whatsapp message), websites, software, systems etc. in every possible way we could do.

Setting-up Study Material and setup study environment for online/ offline class

We updated our student's databank, created many new Whatsapp groups arranged white boards for teachers, Smart phones with high speed internet pack, tie-ups with Microsoft for Teams account, Zoom Account was already running. I also appreciate our reliable publishers, who delivered or available the book sets for students at their doorstep during lockdown.

Training of staff and students for online classroom

Our IT staff was continuously training our teachers to adapt technology, particularly Zoom classrooms, handling of mobile camera. It was a challenge at first but we did get the hang of it quickly.

Not all problems related to technology

As soon as we overcame technology problem, many new problem started to arise. Many of our students were camera shy and they took time to adjust to online classes. So, we had to make them comfortable too. In this context, I remember **Ms. Anju Yadav's** (Principal Suraj School Pataudi) excellent remarks and efforts with students, "There were so many things that happened naturally in classrooms but online, we made sure the students feel the environment of classroom. We started to keep the records of each and every students to be available on time and every student must be dressed up on time for online classes in proper dress as they were present in regular class."

Tricks to keep engaged our junior students.

It has been particularly challenging for those who teaches to younger kids. I can understand, it's very hard to keep the students focused during online classes as they were could have been easily distracted Kids are very young at that age. They get bored easily so we had to give them something new every hour. In a classroom, it is easier because you could use the environment around you. I am thankful to all the principals, coordinators and teachers of all schools, who really handled the situation nicely and came up with many new innovations.

Mrs. Ruchi Adlakha, the Headmistress Coordinators for primary wing, Suraj School Gurgaon Sector 75) who handles Nursery and KG students. She had to bring her theatre experience and learnt to create fun lectures where she would dress up as different characters. It was the best way to keep our primary students involved. But it required a lot of efforts.



She and her team needs to prepare many small projects at home arranging stationary from the market as they were closed for a long time. That was really amazing experience and challenge for all of us to show our art-craft skills with items and stationary available at home. "On this point I really appreciate my primary wing department for their excellent efforts they had put during the school lockdown. If you are a parent, I would request for a favor go to our social media pages of any school and explore them. You will be satisfied to see the efforts of our staff, which they Putin done to train our students during this time.

Maintain Decorum discipline for online class

Suraj Education Group is known for its discipline in institutions.

According to Mr. Bhoop Singh,(Coordinator 11th -12th Suraj School, Mahendergarh) "Most of the times, students are attentive, but sometimes they try to take shortcuts with attendance. I ask them a simple question and try to make two way communication rather than one way." we have inculcated the habit of question- answer session during the online classes too.

Worry about Competitive Exams

I was also worried about for those students who were preparing for competitive exams like NTSE, IIT- JEE, PMT, NEET, CPT etc. But our publishing department and with our 30 year's experience made the content available to all the students who were Preparing for various competitive exams.

Dealing with parents in online PTM

As parents were also at home and they were closely monitoring our faculty how they teach their kids. Moreover many times parent interrupt in the middle of class, With several parents, particularly of the young kids, sitting with their wards during online class, their interference during online class has increased and many a times they force teachers to teach in their way. We took Online PTM every month, parents generally give advices and feedback which our teachers accepts happily and we update our education system regularly. This experience for our staff was new to deal with adults. I can understand the challenge our teachers faced during this pandemic, having taught online with no physical interactions, with parents sitting and judging them. But now I feel this will help our hardworking teachers in future and boost their confidence that




they can do anything. Learnings from this pandemic have made all of us better and more confident education group.

Suraj Education Group is using various methodology to reach their students, we are also missing regular classes as we have planned so many physical and educational activities for our students. Dead Sea (Earth's lowest elevation point)

Introduction

Dead Sea is a salt lake bordered by Jordan to the east and Israel and The West Bank to the west. Its total area is 605 Sq. KM having a surface elevation of -430 Meter and length of 50 Km. It lies in a desert where rainfall is scanty and irregular. It is known as dead sea because it does not offer conditions for the maintenance of species of living animals and plants due to very high salt concentration.

An interesting fact about Dead Sea is that nobody sinks in this because it is 9 to 10 times saltier than other oceans of the world. Also being so dense and mineral rich that it does not even feel like normal water, more like olive oil mixed with sand.

One can float over it even reading a newspaper

About 2.5 million years ago, heavy stream flow into the lake deposited thick sediments of shale, clay, sand stone, rock salt and gypsum etc. were dropped into the layers of sand and gravel. In the lake, water is evaporated faster than it was replenished by precipitation during past 10,000 years leading to an approximate thickness of deposits is between 1.6 to 6.4 Kms.

OOO... So..these are the causes of its high density!!

In late 20th century southern basin was subdivided into dozens of large evaporation pools for the extraction of salt. People with painful skin disease; Psoriasis seem to find relief in the combination of mineral rich water, soothing mud and intense sunlight.

History of Kho Kho

The Asian Kho Kho Federation first came into existence in 1987 at the time of third SAF Games in India. The game gained international credit with first Asian Kho Kho Championship which was held in Kolkata in 1996. The second championship was held in 2000 which added further shine to the game. The Deccan Gymkhana of Pune also tried to lend a sense of reliability and recognition to the game by introducing certain rules and regulations to make it more formal. As a result, countries such as Pakistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka and Maldives also participated in the game.

Common terms in Kho Kho

Pole : A specially made wooden cylindrical construction, erected firmly at both sides of playfield.

Chaser : The sitting team who tries to catch the opponent team member who is running. Chaser sit-in square over cross lines with an alternative back.

Runner : The player of opposition who saves himself from being catch by the chaser.

Central lane : Two parallel lines from one pole to other.

Cross lane : The parallel lanes cutting central line at the middle of playing area.

Kho : The word Kho is actually a pass given by one chaser to another.

Early getup : When the sitting chaser gets up before getting a Kho.

Rule book

Each team will have 12 players but only 9 of them can compete on the pitch.

A standard match encompasses two innings.

Each inning will have 9 minutes which includes chasing and running.

The chasing team sits or kneels in the middle of the court in a row.

Each player sitting next to each other will see on the opposite sides (in alternative direction).

The chasers should end in the quickest time possible.

The chaser will touch the nearest possible player on his/her back and say 'Kho' to give him a chance to chase.

The team that takes the shortest amount of time to touch the player chased, is adjudged as the winner.

ISA CURRICULUM ACTIVITY 5 SUPERNAL FASCINATION ACTIVITY 3- MOVIE TIME


